in over 4 decades of providing Christian education to the greater Lebanon community, there have been some amazing highs and difficult lows, but the one constant has been raising up Christ followers.

Just a few days ago a mother shared with me how a group of teenage girls from East Linn impacted her family. She has a son in high school attending East Linn, and daughter attending an alternate program due to some significant learning needs. A group of East Linn girls became aware of this girl's circumstances and decided to build a friendship with her. In the process of getting to know her, they discovered her birthday was coming up. The girls decided to throw a birthday party for her. They went all out! Balloons, ribbon, cake... the works! With tears in her eyes, this mother expressed to me how much this meant to her family, and especially to her daughter. This was the first "friend" birthday party her high school age daughter had ever had.

It's stories like this that remind me of the good work that is happening here at East Linn. When teenage girls demonstrate Christ like love, it assures me that formational learning is happening. This is the behavior of a Christ follower. Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers (Galatians 6:10).

Sports Updates



Fall sports season ended with a couple of post-season appearance for our athletes. Junior Daisy Lalonde placed 2nd at the 3A/2A/1A cross country state race. She has now finished in the top 3 at State all 3 years. Our girls soccer team, who is co-oping with Central Linn, lost a hard fought 2-1 game at North Valley in the 2nd round of the State tournament. Congratulations to our all-league and all-state fall athletes. Daisy Lalonde was 1st team all-district and 1st team all-state in cross country, Josie Grunerud was 2nd team all-district in girls soccer, Emmett Darwood and Arye Harrington were 2nd team all-league in volleyball, and Bain Pool was honorable mention all-district goalie in boys soccer. Gavin Wilson played on the offensive and defensive lines for Central Linn football in the State playoffs and Brison Edwards was the starting quarterback for the Lebanon Warriors who made it to the quarterfinals of the State football playoffs.

Winter sports has started for MS girls basketball. MS boys basketball will start after Christmas Break. High school basketball begins official practice on Monday, November 13 and will begin the season with our Silver Cross tournament on December 1st & 2nd. Two rule changes that you will notice this season are a 35 second shot clock (optional for JV) and the end of 1 and 1 free throws. The 5th foul of each quarter will now result in 2 free throws.
