School Safety: Standard Response Protocol

East Linn School will be learning how to respond during an emergency situation. We will be having a training drill for our Standard Response Protocol (SRP). This will happen on Wednesday October 18, 2023, at 8:30am to 9:30am. This is a training drill which is to train Staff and Students the protocol and how to react when the alert goes out. At this time all our teachers are helping educate our students in their classrooms on the protocol which we will practice on October 18th. I have attached a description of the five specific actions we will train on and use for our school campus. SRP is Action Based. The Standard Response Protocol (SRP) is based on the response to any given situation not on individual scenarios. Like the Incident Command System (ICS), SRP demands a specific vocabulary but also allows for great flexibility. The premise is simple - these five specific actions (see attached paper) that can be performed during an incident. When communicating these, the action is labeled with a "Term of Action" and is then followed by a "Directive." Execution of the action is performed by staff and students. Once we have the protocol down our next attempt is to have a training drill with our local first responders (looking at the 2024 school year for this type of training drill). Our goal this year is to get our students trained and to react to the protocol that we have for safety on our campus. East Linn takes this very seriously and puts safety for our campus a high priority. If you have any questions, please reach out to the school.
