

TEACHING FOR TRANSFORMATION SPOTLIGHT

ELEMENTARY SPANISH - "LAS POSADAS"









For the last three years our elementary students have taken part in a tradition known as Las Posadas. This is a tradition commonly celebrated in Hispanic and Latino communities around the world that commemorates the journey of Mary and Joseph to Bethlehem. As part of the tradition each grade is responsible for representing a different part of the celebration. Kindergarteners create little lanterns that light the way for Mary and Joseph. First graders create special gifts to lay at the feet of baby Jesus. Second and third graders dress up as angels and read scripture from the book of Luke to announce the birth of Jesus in both Spanish and English. Fifth graders dress as Mary, Joseph, and innkeepers as they reenact the journey from long ago going class to class asking for shelter. Fourth graders welcome them in at the final location offering them shelter in a stable. Once each class has done their part we complete the celebration with traditional games and yummy treats. The goal of the project is to explore different ways of celebrating culture in hopes that we might see more clearly that our true belonging is in God's Kingdom with all of His children that He has uniquely created in His image.

9TH - 12TH LEADERSHIP - "BE A BETTER LOBSTER"

The 9-12 Leadership class is made up of our ASB and Student Council. They serve the student body by finding ways to build community and make space for the belonging of others. One of the ways we've done that this year is writing a card to a member of our school community and delivering it as a class in person every Friday . Students nominate someone at school who is kind, could use encouragement, or as a way to tell someone they're appreciated. When we deliver the card, someone tells the recipient why they're awesome and that we are glad they're at East Linn Christian, and then take a picture of the whole class with that person right as the bell rings for the weekend.



11TH CAREER EDUCATION- "IN GOD'S PRESENCE, WE CAN BE PRESENT"





Students were determined to go out into the world to make a difference. The Career Education students chose to take on 5 weeks of tasks including writing 10 encouraging notes a week. We all agreed that people tend to be more depressed when they spend a lot of money on groceries, so we gave them nice encouraging notes to uplift their moods. We handed out an estimated 200 out of 550 notes.

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

"LOVE MUST BE SINCERE"

In 2025 virtually all 365 days of the year have been adopted as a national day of sorts. Some are significant and others rather trivial. Since the national bicentennial year of 1976 February has been "Black History Month." That sounds pretty important, but not all days have been. "Groundhog's Day" has been celebrated on February 2nd since 1886. "Washington's Birthday" (est.1879) was a national holiday celebrated on February 22nd until it was combined with Lincoln's Birthday and broadened to "President's Day" which was conveniently moved to the 3rd Monday of the month in 1971. The list of recognized days to celebrate has since reached a number that is truly absurd. But there is one day in February that is remembered by almost everyone and that is February 14th – "Valentine's Day."

Valentine's Day was almost a holy day in public schools when I was a kid. There was a concerted effort to make sure that every child in the classroom got a card, a nice note, and sometimes a sweet treat from every other classmate. ELC holds similar traditions. In the elementary building classes have parties, and on the days preceding the 14th Mr. Bates recognizes "random acts of kindness" between students. At middle and high school where romantic affections are frowned upon, we play a game of stealing paper hearts students wear and must surrender if persuaded to talk to a peer of the opposite sex. 
